**In the case of a remote format of the conference; links for participants to enter the event will be additionally notified and posted on the conference website.**

Materials of up to 3 pages of printed text in \*.rtf format are accepted (Times New Roman 14 font, single line spacing, perimeter margins – 2.5 cm, paragraph indentation 1 cm). Pages are not numbered.

**Title: in capital letters with center alignment, without indentation, bold font.**

**Separated by a line: Full name of the author(s) (no more than two): centered, without indentation, bold text. On the next line: the name of the represented university (organization), locality, country with alignment in the center, without indentation, the usual font.**

**Through the line: keywords reflecting the main content of the materials (terms defining the subject area and other important concepts) - 5-7 words or phrases, with alignment in width, paragraph indentation of 1 cm, the outline is usual.**

**Through the line: the text of the materials, which should include an introduction (relevance, purpose) and highlighted structural parts: material and methods (material and methods), results and their discussion (findings and their discussion), conclusion (conclusion), which are highlighted in bold.**

At the end of the report is a list of references, designed in accordance with the requirements of the Higher Attestation Commission of the Republic of Belarus. References to sources are given in the text in square brackets.

Manuscripts are not edited. The authors and their supervisors are responsible for the scientific content and presentation of the materials. The decision to publish the materials is made by the editorial board. Materials that do not correspond to the scientific directions of the conference, submitted in violation of the requirements, submitted later than the specified period, have not passed the verification procedure through the Antiplagiarism check system, are not accepted for consideration and are not sent back. Materials accepted for publication will be printed free of charge.

The collection of materials is planned to be published at the beginning of the conference and placed on the RSCI platform.
